

Do NOT connect the unit to a computer with the USB cable until prompted to do so during the setup of Multi-Function Station (CD-ROM).



Be sure to use the USB cable supplied with this unit.

- This unit is compatible with Caller ID. You must subscribe to the appropriate service offered by your service provider/telephone company.
- Designed to be used in Middle East, Malaysia, Asia, Australia, New Zealand, Tunisia and Africa according to the location setting feature. The default setting is Middle East. To change the location setting, see page 63 (feature #114).

Note for Australian and New Zealand users:

• We recommend to change the recording paper type setting to "Plain Paper". See page 65 (feature #383).


Fuser unit



During or immediately after printing, the fuser unit (①) gets hot. This is normal. Do not touch the fuser unit.

Note:

• The area near the recording paper exit (2) may also get warm. This is normal.



For best performance

Toner cartridge and drum cartridge

- When replacing the toner cartridge or drum cartridge, do not allow dust, water, or liquids to come in contact with the drum. This may affect print quality.
- For optimal performance, genuine Panasonic toner cartridges and drum cartridges are recommended. We cannot be responsible for problems that may be caused by a non-Panasonic toner cartridge or drum cartridge:
 - Damage to the unit
 - Poor print quality
 - Improper operation

Toner cartridge

• Do not leave the toner cartridge out of the protective bag for a long time. It will decrease the toner life.

Drum cartridge

- Read the instructions on page 13 before you begin installation of the drum cartridge. After you have read them, open the drum cartridge protective bag. The drum cartridge contains a photosensitive drum. Exposing it to light may damage the drum. Once you have opened the protective bag:
 - Do not expose the drum cartridge to light for more than 3 minutes.
 - Do not touch or scratch the black drum surface.
 - Do not place the drum cartridge near dust or dirt, or in a high humidity area.
 - Do not expose the drum cartridge to direct sunlight.
- To extend the life of the drum cartridge, the power switch should never be turned OFF immediately after printing. Leave the power turned ON for a minimum of 30 minutes after printing.

Location


• To avoid malfunction, do not position the unit near appliances such as TVs or speakers which generate an intense magnetic field.

Static electricity

• To prevent static electricity damage to the interface connectors or other electrical components inside the unit, touch a grounded metal surface before touching the components.

Environment

- Keep the unit away from electrical noise generating devices, such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The unit should be kept free from dust, high temperature and vibration.
- The unit should not be exposed to direct sunlight.
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the unit. When you leave the unit unused for a long period of time, unplug this unit from the power outlet.
- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as heaters, kitchen stoves, etc. Damp basements should also be avoided.
- During the printing process, heat is used to fuse toner onto the page. As a result, it is normal for the machine to produce an odour during and shortly after printing. Be sure to use this unit in an area with proper ventilation.
- Do not cover slots or openings on the unit. Inspect the air circulation vents regularly and remove any dust build-up with a vacuum cleaner (①).






• Wipe the outer surface of the unit with a soft cloth. Do not use benzine, thinner, or any abrasive powder.

Moving the unit

The unit is heavy. It is highly recommended that two people handle this unit.

When moving the unit, hold by the grips (1) on both sides.



(1) A4/letter paper stacker

- We recommend opening the A4/letter paper stacker when using A4 or letter-size recording paper. Do not open it when using legal-size recording paper.
- For A4-size, slide the stacker to the rightmost position, then open it.
 For letter-size, just open the stacker (no need to slide it).
- The A4/letter paper stacker may not be shown in all illustrations.




1.6 Toner cartridge and drum cartridge

The supplied toner cartridge is a starter toner cartridge. **Caution:**

- Read the following instructions before you begin installation. After you have read them, open the drum cartridge protective bag. The drum cartridge contains a photosensitive drum. Exposing it to light may damage the drum. Once you have opened the protective bag:
 - Do not expose the drum cartridge to light for more than 3 minutes.
 - Do not touch or scratch the black drum surface inside of the drum cartridge.
 - Do not place the drum cartridge near dust or dirt, or in a high humidity area.
 - Do not expose the drum cartridge to direct sunlight.
- Do not leave the toner cartridge out of the protective bag for a long time. It will decrease the toner life.
- We cannot be responsible for any damage to the unit or degradation of print quality which may occur from the use of a non-Panasonic toner cartridge and drum cartridge.
- Do not add toner to the toner cartridge.
- Remove the toner cartridge (①) and drum cartridge
 (②) from the protective bags.




2 Shake the toner cartridge horizontally more than 5 times.




3 Detach the protective cover (③) from the toner cartridge, and remove the protective sheet (④) from the drum cartridge.


• Do not touch or scratch the black drum or toner surfaces.




Insert the toner cartridge (⑤) into the drum cartridge
 (⑥) from the upper angle.




5 Push down the toner cartridge (⑦) to lock into place.

6 Hold the left cover release lever ((9)), and then pull open the left cover ((10)).









• During or immediately after printing, the fuser unit (11) gets hot. Wait until the fuser unit cools down.

- 7 Install the drum and toner unit (12) by holding the centre handle.
 - Make sure that the arrows ((13)) match to install the drum and toner unit correctly.





8 Close the left cover.



When to replace the toner cartridge and the drum cartridge

When the display shows the following, replace the toner cartridge.

- "Change Supplies Toner Low"
- "Change Supplies Toner Empty"




- To check the drum life and quality, please print the printer test list (page 109) and refer to page 111 for information on the drum life. If printing quality is still poor or "Replace Drum" appears on the display, replace the toner cartridge and drum cartridge.
- To ensure that the unit operates properly, we recommend the use of **Panasonic toner cartridge and drum cartridge**. See page 10 for accessory information.
- See page 110 for information on toner life and drum life.


Cleaning the drum cartridge

Important:

- If the groove of the drum cartridge is dirty, lines or dirty patterns may appear on printed sheets. Be sure to remove any toner remaining on the inside of the drum cartridge to maintain the print quality.
- A cleaner for the drum cartridge is supplied with the replacement toner cartridge. If you replace only the toner cartridge, clean the drum cartridge using the cleaner.
- Insert the cleaner (1) into the left groove (1) and move it from side to side at least 3 times to clean the inside of the drum cartridge. Repeat this for the right groove (1).







Note:

• Be sure to clean all the way to the edge of each groove.

Waste disposal method

Waste material should be disposed of under conditions which meet all national and local environmental regulations.

Toner save feature

If you want to reduce toner consumption, set the toner save setting to ON (feature #482 on page 66). The toner cartridge will last approximately 20 % longer. This feature may lower the print quality.

1.7 Recording paper

The standard input tray unit can hold:


- Up to 520 sheets of 75 g/m² paper.
- Up to 470 sheets of 80 g/m² paper.
- Up to 410 sheets of 90 g/m^2 paper.
- Up to 100 sheets of 105 g/m^2 paper.
- Up to 25 transparencies.^{*1}
- Up to 25 labels.^{*1}
- *1 Only when using the unit as a printer. See page 31 for details.
- The number of sheets may vary due to paper thickness variation during paper manufacturing.
- The unit is set for printing A4-size thin paper by default.
 - To use other paper sizes, change the recording paper size setting (feature #380 on page 65).
 - To use plain or thick paper, change the recording paper type setting (feature #383 on page 65).

Note for recording paper:

- We recommend that you test paper (especially special sizes and types of paper) on the unit before purchasing large quantities.
- Do not use the following types of paper:
 - Paper with cotton and/or fibre content that is over 20 %, such as letterhead paper or paper used for resumes
 - Extremely smooth or shiny paper, or paper that is highly textured
 - Coated, damaged or wrinkled paper
 - Paper with foreign objects attached, such as tabs or staples
 - Paper that has dust, lint or oil stains
 - Paper that will melt, vaporize, discolour, scorch or emit dangerous fumes near 200 °C, such as vellum paper. These materials may transfer onto the fusing roller and cause damage.
 - Moist paper
 - Inkjet paper
- Some paper is designed to be printed on only one side. Try printing on the other side of the paper if you are not happy with the print quality, or if misfeeding occurs.
- For proper paper feeding and best print quality, we recommend using long-grained paper.
- Do not use paper of different types or thicknesses at the same time. This may cause paper jams.
- Do not use paper printed from this unit for doublesided printing with other copiers or printers. This may cause paper jams.
- To avoid curling, do not open paper packs until you are ready to use the paper. Store unused paper in the original packaging, in a cool and dry location.
- For customers who live in high humidity areas: Please be sure to store paper in an air-conditioned

room at all times. If you print using moist paper, it may cause paper jam.


1 Pull the standard input tray (①) until it clicks into place, then pull it completely out, lifting the front part of the tray.




2 Before loading a stack of paper, fan the paper to prevent paper jams.




Pinch the right side of the recording paper guide (②), then slide it to match the paper size mark.
 Pinch the front and back recording paper guides (③) at the same time, then slide them together to match the paper size mark.



- 4 Load the paper, print-side up (④). Important:
 - Push down to lock the plate (5) in the standard input tray, if it has come up.




Make sure that the recording paper guides (6) are at the paper size mark and the recording paper is under the paper limit mark (7). The paper should not be loaded over the tab (8).

5 Insert the standard input tray into the unit, lifting the front part of the tray. Then push it completely into the unit.




Note:

- If the paper is not loaded correctly, re-adjust the paper guides, or the paper may jam.
- If the standard input tray does not close, the plate in the standard input tray may not be in the locked position. Push the paper down and make sure that the paper is lying flat in the standard input tray.


Caution for the standard input tray

• Do not drop the standard input tray.



• Hold the standard input tray with both hands when removing or installing. The standard input tray weighs approximately 4.8 kg when fully loaded with recording paper.


Do not touch the plate ((9)) on the left side of the standard input tray.



2.1 Connections

Caution:

- When you operate this product, the power outlet should be near the product and easily accessible.
- Be sure to use the telephone line cord supplied with this unit.
- Do not extend the telephone line cord.





 - Connect to a single telephone line jack.
- ③ [EXT] jack
 - You can connect an answering machine or an extension telephone. Remove the stopper if attached.

- (5) To the Internet
- (6) Network router/Network hub (not supplied)
 - Also connect networked computers.
- ⑦ LAN cable (not supplied)
 - To assure continued emission limit compliance, use only shielded LAN cable (category 5 straight cable).
- *1 The power cord or telephone line cord may differ slightly. Use the appropriate power cord or telephone line cord for where you use the unit.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR THE USB CONNECTION

 DO NOT CONNECT THE UNIT TO A COMPUTER WITH THE USB CABLE UNTIL PROMPTED TO DO SO DURING THE SETUP OF MULTI-FUNCTION STATION (page 26).

Note:

- Do not place any objects within the following distance:
 - Left side ((8)): 40 cm
 - Right side ((9)) and back side ((10)): 10 cm
- If any other device is connected to the same telephone line, this unit may disturb the network condition of the device.
- If you use the unit with a computer and your internet provider instructs you to install a filter (①), please connect it as follows.



• A telephone handset cannot be connected directly to this unit. To talk to the other party, please connect an extension telephone.






2.3 Dialling mode

Important:

• Not available when "Australia" or "New Zealand" is selected in feature #114 on page 63.

If you cannot dial (page 44), change this setting according to your telephone line service.



- 1 [Menu]
- 2 Press [#][1][2][0] to display "Dialling Mode".
- 3 Press [1] or [2] to select the desired setting.
 [1] "Pulse": For rotary/pulse dial service.
 [2] "Tone" (default): For tone dial service.
- 4 [Set]
- 5 Press [Menu] to exit.

2.4 Selecting the operation mode (Scan/Copy/Fax)

You can select the desired mode by pressing one of the following buttons.




- **[Scan]**: Select this mode when using the unit as a scanner (page 33).
- [Copy]: Select this mode when using the unit as a copier (page 37).
- [Fax]: Select this mode when using the unit as a fax machine (page 44).

Note:

- The default operation mode is the copy mode.
- You can change the default operation mode (feature #463 on page 66) and the timer before returning to the default operation mode (feature #464 on page 66).

2.5 Setting the original

2.5.1 Using the scanner glass




- 1 Open the document cover (①).
- 2 Place the document FACE DOWN on the scanner glass (②), aligning the top left of the document with the corner where the ↘ mark is positioned.
- **3** Close the document cover.


Note:

- Confirm that there are no documents in the automatic document feeder.
- Place the original onto the scanner glass gently. To avoid malfunction, do not press down too firmly.
- If the original is a thick book, do not close the document cover.
- Confirm that any ink, paste or correction fluid has dried completely.
- Effective scanning area is shown by the shaded area:

2.5.2 Using the automatic document feeder



- 1 Insert the document (up to 50 pages) FACE UP into the feeder until a single beep is heard.
- 2 Adjust the width of the document guides (①) to fit the actual size of the document.


Note:

- Confirm that there are no documents on the scanner glass.
- Confirm that any ink, paste or correction fluid has dried completely.
- Remove clips, staples or other fasteners.
- Do not insert the following types of documents (Make a copy of the document using the scanner glass and set the copy instead.):
 - Chemically treated paper such as carbon or carbonless duplicating paper
 - Electrostatically charged paper
 - Badly curled, creased or torn paper
 - Paper with a coated surface
 - Paper with printing on the opposite side that can be seen through the other side, such as newsprint
- The total height of the documents when laid flat, must be less than 5 mm. If the documents exceed the capacity of the automatic document feeder, they may fall or cause a jam in the feeder.
- To set a document with a width of less than 210 mm, we recommend using the scanner glass to copy the original document onto A4 or letter-size paper, then setting the copied document for better results.
- Do not set documents that do not satisfy the requirements of size and weight. Make a copy of the document using the scanner glass and set the copy.
- Available document size, document weight and effective scanning area are as follows:


Minimum document size

- When using the unit as a scanner (page 33, 35), the effective scanning length depends on the selected paper size.



- Single sheet: 45 g/m² to 90 g/m²
- Multiple sheets:
 60 g/m² to 80 g/m²

2.6 Adjusting the volume

Important:

• Before adjusting the volume, set the operation mode to fax mode. If the [Fax] light is OFF, turn it ON by pressing [Fax].



Ringer volume

- Press (▼) or (▲) repeatedly to select "Ringer Volume".
- 2. Press [◄] or [►].

To turn the ringer OFF


- Press (▼) or (▲) repeatedly to select "Ringer Volume".
- Press [] repeatedly to display "Ringer Off" in the status bar.
 - The unit will not ring.
 - To turn the ringer back ON, press [>].

Monitor volume

- 1. While using the monitor, press [▼] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Monitor Volume".
- 2. Press [◄] or [►].

2.7 Date and time

We recommend you to set the date and time. The other party will receive your unit's date and time as the header information.



[Set] [▼][▲][◄][►]

1 [Menu] \rightarrow [\ddagger][1][0][1] \rightarrow [Set]

- 2 Enter the current date/month/year/hour/minute. Press (*) repeatedly to select 12-hour time entry or 24-hour time entry.
 - If you selected 12-hour time entry, press [▼] or
 [▲] repeatedly to select "AM" or "PM".

Example: 10 August, 2009 10:15 PM (12 hour clock format)

- Press (▼) or (▲) repeatedly to select "Date".
 → (◄)/(►)
- 2. Press [1][0] [0][8] [2][0][0][9].

- 3. [Set]
- Press [▼] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Time".
 → [◄]/[►]
- 5. Press [*], then press [1][0][1][5].
- 6. Press [▼] or [▲] repeatedly to select "PM".

7. [Set]

3 Press [Menu] to exit.

Note:

- Your unit's date and time will be used as the header information for the following:
 - When sending as an attached file to an email destination directly from this unit (Scan to email address) (page 34).
 - When sending faxes (page 44).
- If the date and time is not set correctly, the other party will receive an incorrect date and time as their header. This may confuse the other party.

To correct a mistake

Press $[\triangleleft]$ or $[\succ]$ to move the cursor to the incorrect number, and make the correction.


If you have subscribed to a Caller ID service

The date and time will be automatically set according to the received caller information.

- To use this feature, make sure the time adjustment is turned ON (feature #226 on page 65).
- If the time has not previously been set, Caller ID will not adjust the clock.
- You can turn this feature OFF (feature #226 on page 65).

2.8 Your logo

You can program your logo (name, company name, etc.) so that it appears on the top of each page sent.



1 [Menu] \rightarrow [\ddagger][1][0][2] \rightarrow [Set]

- 2 Enter your logo, up to 30 characters (see page 83 for character entry). → [Set]
- 3 Press [Menu] to exit.





• To erase all characters, press and hold [Back].

2.9 Your fax number

You can program your fax number so that it appears on the top of each page sent.

- 2 Enter your fax number, up to 20 digits.
 - To enter a "+", press [+].
 - To enter a space, press [#].
 - To enter a hyphen, press [Flash].
 - To erase a number, press [Back].
- 3 [Set]
- 4 Press [Menu] to exit.

To correct a mistake

Press [◄] or [►] to move the cursor to the incorrect number, and make the correction.

• To erase all numbers, press and hold [Back].

2.10 Configuring the unit to access the LAN

You can print documents, scan documents, receive faxes or send faxes using a computer connected to the LAN. To enable these features, you need to set the IP address, subnet mask, and default gateway for the unit.

Important:

 Consult your network administrator when setting the IP address, subnet mask, and default gateway.

2.10.1 Setting up automatically with a DHCP server

Your situation:

- When only one unit is connected to the LAN.

If your network administrator manages the network with a DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol) server, it will automatically assign an IP (Internet Protocol) address, subnet mask, and default gateway to the unit.

To correct a mistake in the IP address, subnet mask, or default gateway

Press [◄] or [►] to move the cursor to the incorrect number, and make the correction.

You need to select the computer that will be used for receiving faxes.





- Do not re-use transparencies that have already been fed through the unit. This includes transparencies that have been fed through and ejected without being printed on.
- Some types of transparencies have instructions recommending which side to print on. If the print quality is poor, try printing on the other side of a new transparency.






3.2 Printing a received email attachment automatically (LAN connection only)

If you configure the POP server settings beforehand, the unit will automatically print files attached to an email that are sent from a compatible unit via the Internet (scan to email print). This is useful if you want to print only attached files, without checking your emails.

Important:

- The unit does not print email messages.
- The unit will only print attached files sent from a compatible unit, which can send emails directly (without using a computer).
- The attachment file formats that can be printed are as follows:



• The document will be sent through the unit from your computer.



You have a separate telephone line just for faxes, or you want to use the unit only for receiving faxes.

All incoming calls will be answered as faxes.

Important:

• Not available when "Australia" or "New Zealand" is selected in feature #114 on page 63.

Your situation

You want to answer phone calls yourself and receive faxes automatically without rings.

Setup

Set the unit to TEL/FAX mode (page 51) by pressing **[Fax Auto Answer]** repeatedly.

• The [Fax Auto Answer] indicator is OFF.



Note:

 Make sure feature #404 is set to "Tel/Fax" beforehand (page 67).

How phone calls and faxes are received

If the call is a phone call, the unit will ring. If a fax calling tone is detected, the unit will receive the fax automatically without ringing.

6.6.4 Use with answering machine

Your situation

You want to use the unit with an answering machine.

Setup

Connect an external telephone answering machine and set the ring count of the answering machine to less than 4.

• Set the ring count in FAX ONLY mode of the unit to more than 4, if you use with auto answer ON.

How to receive calls



- **3.** The unit will answer the call and try to detect a fax calling tone.

When a fax calling tone is detected





- 4 Select the desired destination.

Saving to your computer:

 - The fax document will be automatically saved in the folder selected in the [Settings] window. To change the folder, see page 29.
 - The software that is associated to open PDF files will automatically start.

Saving as an email attachment:



6.10 Using the unit with an answering machine

6.10.1 Setting up the unit and an answering machine

- 1 Connect the answering machine (①).
 - An answering machine is not supplied.
 - Remove the stopper (2) if attached.



- 2 Set the number of rings on the answering machine to 4 rings or less.
 - This will allow the answering machine to answer the call first.
- **3** Record a greeting message on the answering machine.
 - We recommend you record a message that is under 10 seconds long, and not to pause for more than 4 seconds during the message. Otherwise, neither machine will function correctly.
- 4 Activate the answering machine.
- 5 Set the unit to the desired receiving mode (page 50).
 - If you set it to FAX ONLY mode, change the ring count in FAX ONLY mode to more than 4 (feature #210 on page 64).
- 6 Make sure each of the following is unique:
 - the remote access code of the answering machine
 - the fax activation code (feature #434 on page 69)

Note:

• If the call is a phone call, the answering machine will record voice messages.

If a fax calling tone is detected, the fax machine will receive a fax automatically.

• Regarding the remote access code for the answering machine, see the operating instructions of the answering machine.

Receiving a voice message and fax document in one call

The caller can leave a voice message and send a fax document during the same call. Inform the caller of the following procedure beforehand.

- 1. The caller calls your unit.
 - The answering machine will answer the call.
- 2. The caller can leave a message after the greeting message.
- The caller presses [*][#][9] (pre-selected fax activation code).
 - The unit will activate the fax function.
- 4. The caller presses the start button to send a document.

Note:

- To use this feature, make sure remote fax activation is turned ON (feature #434 on page 69). The fax activation code can also be changed.
- If there is no room left in the memory of your answering machine, the unit may not be able to receive documents. See the operating instructions of the answering machine and erase unnecessary messages.

6.11 Receive polling (retrieving a fax placed on another fax machine)

This feature allows you to retrieve a document from another compatible machine. Therefore you pay for the call.

Make sure that no documents are fed into your unit and that the other party's machine is ready for your call.

- Make sure that the [Fax] light is ON.
- 1 [Advance]
- 2 Press [▼] or [▲] repeatedly to display "Polling". → [Set]
- 3 Dial the fax number. \rightarrow [Set] \rightarrow [Start]

6.12 Junk fax prohibitor (preventing fax reception from undesired callers)

If you subscribe to Caller ID service (page 58), this feature prevents fax reception from calls that do not show caller information.

Additionally, the unit will not accept faxes originating from numbers that match the ones on a programmable junk fax prohibitor list.

• Make sure that the [Fax] light is ON.

Important:

• This feature does not work if you receive faxes manually.

6.12.1 Activating the junk fax prohibitor

- 2 Press [v] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk Fax Prohibitor". → [Set]
- 3 Press (▼) or (▲) repeatedly to select "Prohibitor".

6.12.2 Storing undesired callers

You can register up to 20 undesired numbers from the Caller ID list (page 59) if you do not wish to receive faxes from them.

- 2 Press [v] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk Fax Prohibitor". → [Set]
- 3 Press [V] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk List Set". → [Set]
- 4 Press [▼] or [▲] repeatedly to display the party you do not want to receive faxes from. → [Set]
 - If you have programmed the wrong item, press [Set] again to remove "<" and cancel the item.
- 5 [Back] \rightarrow [Advance]

To display the junk fax prohibitor list

- 1. [Advance]
- Press [V] or (▲) repeatedly to select "Junk Fax Prohibitor". → [Set]
- Press [V] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk List Display". → [Set]
- 4. Press [v] or [] to display the items on the list.
- 5. Press [Advance] to exit.

To print the junk fax prohibitor list

1. [Advance]

- Press [V] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk Fax Prohibitor". → [Set]
- Press [v] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk List Print". → [Set]
- 4. Press [Advance] to exit.

To erase an item from the junk fax prohibitor list

- 1. [Advance]
- Press [V] or [▲] repeatedly to select "Junk Fax Prohibitor". → [Set]
- Press (▼) or (▲) repeatedly to select "Junk List Display". → [Set]
- Press [▼] or [▲] repeatedly to select the desired item. → [♯]
 - To cancel erasing, press [Stop], then press [Advance].
- 5. [Set] \rightarrow [Advance]

6.13 Receiving a fax on your computer

You can receive a fax document on your computer. The received fax document is saved as an image file (TIFF-G4 format).

Important:

- Make sure the PC fax setting is set to "Always" or "Connected" beforehand (feature #442 on page 70).
- Make sure the computer setting for the PC fax reception is set beforehand (feature #443 on page 26).
- Make sure the fax preview mode is turned OFF beforehand (feature #448 on page 56).
- 1 Press **[Fax Auto Answer]** repeatedly to turn the auto answer setting ON (page 50).
- 2 Start Multi-Function Station. \rightarrow [PC FAX]
- **3** When a fax call is received, your computer will receive a document through the unit.

Note:

• You can view, print or transfer the received document using your computer.

Viewing a received document

- 1. Select [PC FAX] from Multi-Function Station.
- 2. Select [Received Log] in [Communication Log].



- 3. Click the item you want to view.
- 4. Click [File] in the menu bar, then select [View], or click the [View] icon in the toolbar.
 - The received fax will be displayed.

If a received fax document is stored in the unit's memory

You can load the document into your computer.

- 1. Select [PC FAX] from Multi-Function Station.
- 2. Select [Received Log] in [Communication Log].
- 3. Click [File] in the menu bar. \rightarrow [Receive a Fax]
 - If the PC fax setting (feature #442 on page 70) is activated, the received fax document will be automatically transferred to the computer.

6.14 Web fax preview (LAN connection only)

You can display a received fax document in your web browser, and print or save the necessary document after you confirm the image.

Important:

- Web fax preview will not be activated when using the unit for the first time. To activate this feature, set the following:
 - "6.14.1 Activating the fax preview mode", page 56.
 - "6.14.2 Programming the web fax preview access code", page 56.

 If the web fax preview access code is not programmed (blank), the web fax preview feature will not be activated.

6.14.3 Displaying a received fax document on the web browser

Important:

- Make sure that the unit is idle.
- 1 Start Multi-Function Station.
- 2 [Utilities] \rightarrow [Configuration Web Page] \rightarrow [Advance Configuration]
- 3 Type "root" as the user name, then enter the password (feature #155 on page 64). → [OK]
- 4 Select the [Web Fax Preview] tab.

- 5 Enter the web fax preview access code (feature #450 on page 56). → [Submit]
 - A list of the received fax documents will be displayed.
- 6 Click the desired icon to preview, print or save a fax document.
 - While previewing the document, you can
 - manipulate the fax document (Example: enlarge, rotate etc.).
- 7 Close the web browser.

Note:

- The display speed depends on the contents and size of the document.
- The received fax document is saved as an image file (PDF format). Adobe Reader is required to view it.

What "v" means

" \checkmark " on the display means the image has already been viewed, printed or saved.

- To delete a document after viewing a fax document in step 6, click [Back] to go back to the list. You can delete images showing "
 <".
- To delete a document after printing or saving a fax document in step 6, click [Reload] to update the list. You can delete images showing "v".

7.1 Caller ID service

Important:

This unit is compatible with the Caller ID service offered by your local telephone company. To use this unit's Caller ID features, you must subscribe to a Caller ID service.

For users other than Australia and New Zealand: Important:

- This unit is designed in accordance with the ETS (European Telecommunication Standard) and only supports the basic CLIP (Calling Line Identification Presentation) features.
- This unit will only display the caller's telephone number and name.
- This unit will not support future additional telephone services.
- Depending on the service of the local telephone company, the date/time of the call or the caller's name may not be displayed.

Make sure the following ring count is set to 2 or more rings beforehand.

- FAX ring count (feature #210 on page 64)
- TEL/FAX ring count (feature #212 on page 67)
- The name display service may not be available in some areas. For further information, please contact your telephone company.

For New Zealand users:

For all local and national incoming calls, your display will show the area code (e.g. 09 for Auckland) or the cellular prefix (e.g. 0274 for Telecom Cellular) followed by the caller's telephone number. An Auckland caller's number will be displayed as 09XXXXXX. The seven X's represent the seven digits of the caller's telephone number. A caller from a 6-digit Telecom Cellular number will be displayed as 0274XXXXX. For incoming international calls, your display may only show "0000". For business users on a Centrex line, your display will show Centrex extension numbers in the shorter extension number format used within your company.

- Caller information will not be presented on incoming fax calls if Telecom FaxAbility is used.
- Although Telecom New Zealand and TelstraClear do not currently send caller name information, the caller's name will be displayed as stored in the directory, when a call from that caller is received.
- Your telephone company may charge you for a local call if the number dialled has the area code prefix included. If this is unacceptable, dial only the 7-digit local number. Do not dial the [0] prefix or the area code.

Important:

• This unit will only display the caller's telephone number and name.

- This unit will not support future additional telephone services.
- Depending on the service of the local telephone company, the date/time of the call or the caller's name may not be displayed.
- The name display service may not be available in some areas. For further information, please contact your telephone company.

7.1.1 How Caller ID is displayed

The calling party's name or telephone number will be displayed after the 1st ring. You have the option of whether or not to answer the call.

The unit will automatically store caller information (name, telephone number and date and time of the call) from the 30 most recent calls. It is possible to view caller information on the display (page 59) or print the entire Caller ID list (page 109).

- When caller information is received and it matches a telephone number stored in the unit's navigator directory, the stored name will be displayed.
- If the unit is connected to a PBX (Private Branch Exchange) system, caller information may not be received properly. Consult your PBX supplier.
- If the unit cannot receive caller information, the following will be displayed:

"Out of Area": The caller dialled from an area which does not provide Caller ID service. "Private Caller": The caller requested not to send caller information.

"Long Distance": The caller made a long distance call.

Note for Australian users:

• The area code will need to be stored with the 8-digit telephone number.

To confirm caller information by printing the Caller ID list

- To print manually, see page 109.
- To print automatically after every 30 new calls, activate feature #216 (page 65).

7.2 Viewing and calling back using caller information

Important:

- If the area code of the received telephone number is the same as yours, the area code may need to be deleted before calling back. This may only apply to some areas. To edit the number, see page 59.

8.1 Distinctive Ring (Fax Stream Duet/FaxAbility) service

Important:

• Not available when "Malaysia" and "Tunisia" is selected in feature #114 on page 63.

When a call is made to one of your phone numbers, the telephone company sends a ring pattern to your telephone line to indicate which number the call is intended for. By setting up this unit for Distinctive Ring, you can make the unit automatically start fax reception when a call comes to the fax number.

To use this service, you must subscribe to the Distinctive Ring service offered by your local telephone company. Consult your local telephone company for availability.

In Australia, this service is called "Fax Stream Duet". In New Zealand, this service is called "FaxAbility".
